## MEDIA EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP (MES)

Launched in 2003, the Media Education Scholarship (MES) is an initiative by the Infocomm Media Development Authority (IMDA) to nurture and develop industry leaders in the media industry. The MES was further enhanced in 2012 to include industry collaboration through direct job-matching of scholars with companies, to better suit industry demands and requirements, and set a clearer career path for our scholars.

Over 200 scholars, supported by the MES have established themselves in the Singapore media industry, in diverse roles as film and TV directors, game developers and visual effects artists.

#### **CLEAR PATH TO SUCCESS**

Tuition fees and other compulsory university fees will be sponsored by IMDA

An annual allowance from the sponsoring media company will be given to the MES scholar to defray living expenses during the period of study

Job opportunity with the sponsoring media company, where the MES scholar will be developed as a media professional or groomed for a leadership role during the bond period


Training, internship and career opportunities in media management, editorial, interactive media, journalism and TV production will be extended to the MES scholar

## MEDIA EDUCATION SCHOLARSHIP (FILM)

#### FOR ASPIRING FILMMAKERS

In 2013, IMDA introduced a new category, MES (Film), to nurture talent keen on pursuing independent film careers

Aspiring filmmakers can opt for the MES (Film) and work in the Singapore industry upon completion of studies. MES (Film) scholars will have their tuition fees and other compulsory university fees sponsored by IMDA



#### FLIGIBILITY

#### TO APPLY FOR THE MES, YOU MUST:

Be a Singapore citizen with the aspiration to transform and create a positive impact in the media industry

Have applied to an institution for admission to a full-time media-related undergraduate or postgraduate programme - securing a placement at the point of application is not required

Have completed or be exempted from National Service for the period of study

### YOU CAN ALSO APPLY FOR THE MES IF:

You are currently studying in other fields such as business administration, but have a strong interest in media. Please refer to IMDA's list of co-sponsoring companies on their requirements, found in the IMDA website during the MES application period

You have already started your undergraduate or postgraduate programme which has at least one academic year left

#### ASSESSMENT CRITERIA

IMDA IS LOOKING FOR WELL-ROUNDED INDIVIDUALS TO APPLY FOR THE MES. APPLICANTS WILL BE ASSESSED BASED ON THE FOLLOWING:

- Creativity: assessed through a portfolio submitted and/or track record, if any
- Leadership and management potential: assessed through their CCA record, community involvement, and/ or contribution to the media industry (if applicable)
- Other requirements specified by IMDA, and the co-sponsoring companies

Only shortlisted applicants will be notified for an interview. IMDA and the cosponsoring companies reserve the right of non-disclosure for information pertaining to the outcome of applications. All terms and conditions are subject to change and are accurate as at date of update.

IMDA's decision on scholarship grants is final and conclusive, and will not be subjected to any form of appeal or review.


