DIGITAL ACCESS PROGRAMMES

NEU PC Plus

The NEU PC Plus programme supports low-income households with school-going children or persons with disabilities ("**PWDs**") with broadband access and computer ownership. Since it was launched in 1999, the programme has been continually enhanced to address the evolving needs of beneficiaries, and has helped more than 63,000 beneficiaries to date.

Eligible beneficiaries are provided a Personal Computer ("**PC**") bundle comprising a subsidised PC and three years free broadband subscription, from \$224.97 (inclusive of GST). Students who are unable to co-pay for the PC can be further supported through the iNSPIRE Fund.

NEU PC Plus partners including schools; processing agencies like Mendaki, CDAC, SINDA, Eurasian Association; telco partners M1 and NetLink NBN Trust; and PC vendor partner Acer; have worked with IMDA to streamline processes and accelerate provisioning of PC-Bundles.

The revised criteria will take immediate effect, until December 2020.

Home Access Programme

The Home Access programme supports low-income households (without school-going children) with subsidised broadband, and with device bundles as options. The Home Access programme was enhanced in April 2020 to offer faster broadband speeds and more bundled device options. Since its launch in 2014, more than 14,000 beneficiaries have benefitted.



The qualifying criteria of Home Access is:

Criteria
