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FACT SHEET IT Exposed Programme

The IT Exposed programme seeks to equip Infocomm Club students with computing concepts and skills through training workshops aimed at deepening the programming skills of primary and secondary students. The IT Exposed Programme is an initiative under Strategy 3 of the Infocomm Manpower Development Roadmap v2.0 ("MDEV 2.0") to "Generate Curiosity, Interest and Passion" of infocomm.

The programme aims to expose 2,000 Infocomm club students to new computing concepts and technologies (e.g. computational thinking, cloud computing, business analytics) via courses delivered by industry partners and the Institutes of Higher Learning.

Highlights of key achievements

- More than 900 students have been trained since its launch in April 2011.
- 2000 infocomm club students to benefit from programme over four years (2011 – 2014).

Programme Description

The IT Exposed programme aims to develop student interest for programming at a young age and equipping them with computing skills in a fun and engaging manner.

Short workshops are organised to introduce programming skills such as Alice-in-Action programming, Robocode programming, e-books creation, games development and Mobile applications development.

Eligibility Criteria

- Open to primary, secondary schools, centralised institutes, junior colleges and integrated programme schools.
- Students who participate in IT Exposed workshops do not need any prerequisite IT skills.
