*Big Bang Data* will be making its Asian premiere at ArtScience Museum this May. Hailing from the Centre de Cultura Contemporània de Barcelona (CCCB) and Fundación Telefónica in Spain – *Big Bang Data* explores how data is reshaping the world through the work of artists, designers, journalists and visionaries. The exhibition is organised into nine chapters, each seeking to explore the intricate relationship that we share with data, as well as the meaning and implications of datafication for our future. The exhibition aims to make an abstract subject tangible and easily accessible to everyone through striking visual installations. Artworks on display range from large-scale immersive installations to historical artefacts and contemporary data driven artworks, from leading international artists renowned in this field.

As Singapore journeys towards becoming a Smart Nation, data and infocomm technology will be harnessed to improve the lives of citizens, create opportunities and build stronger communities. Exhibiting alongside the international contemporary art installations are data visualisations, interviews with local data experts, and prototypes developed by leading local research institutions in the fields of infocomm technologies. Embracing the 'art' in Smart Nation, the exhibition highlights Singapore's unique relationship with data within the Smart Nation framework and provides a holistic understanding of the ways in which data is affecting our daily lives.

### About ArtScience Museum

ArtScience Museum at Marina Bay Sands is Southeast Asia's leading cultural institution that explores the inter-relationship between art, science, technology and culture. Featuring 21 galleries totaling 50,000 square feet, the iconic lotus-inspired building has staged major exhibitions by some of the 20th century's key artists, including Salvador Dalí, Andy Warhol and Vincent Van Gogh, as well as major exhibitions which explore aspects of scientific history.
