# B. Spectrum Fees, Rights, Rollout Obligations & Moratoriums

#### 1. Spectrum Fees Payable

#### 2. <u>Licensing</u>

Successful bidders who do not own a Facilities-Based Operator (FBO) licence will need to apply for one before deploying their WBA services. Successful bidders who already own FBO licences will need to modify the scope of their systems and services under their existing FBO licence.

# 3. Spectrum Rights

IDA recognises that due to the still-evolving standards of the technology, a longer period is required by successful bidders to recoup their investments in WBA. As such, IDA will grant successful bidders a 10-year spectrum right to provide greater investment certainty to them.

#### 4. Rollout Schedule & WBA Moratorium

IDA will require successful bidders to offer their WBA services to the public within 18 months if they obtain the 2.5 GHz spectrum and/or within 36 months if they obtain the 2.3 GHz spectrum. This takes into account the technology and market developments in the two frequency bands. IDA will not impose a moratorium on the future allocation of wireless broadband spectrum.

#### 5. WBA & 3G Moratorium

IDA recognises that the line distinguishing WBA and 3G is blurring and may converge in future. However, IDA must honour its commitment made in the 3G auction, to not allocate spectrum for 3G mobile communication services before 1 January 2006. Therefore, IDA will distinguish 3G and WBA by their mobility factor. IDA has adopted from the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) definition of "pedestrian mobility speed" for 3G technologies to differentiate between the two.

To be specific, this means that wireless broadband operators may only offer fixed or pedestrian mobile services from now until 31 December 2005. Operators are not allowed to provide mobile services at vehicular speeds for now. This restriction will be lifted once the 3G moratorium ends on 31 December 2005.

IDA will also allow 3G licensees the added option to deploy wireless broadband in their 3G frequency bands. This will allow 3G licensees the flexibility to optimise their 3G spectrum usage and introduce new complementary wireless technologies for consumers.
