Speedcast has the following comments:

On the overall, we do <u>not object</u> to the use of 6 GHz band for RLAN/Wifi 6E under the following conditions:

- That services in the 6 GHz band for RLAN/WiFi6E be provided on a "Non-Protected Non-Interference basis".
- That no new restrictions/constraints be imposed upon on the teleport with regards to full use of 5925-6425 MHz for Fixed Satellite Services uplinks now or in the future, including restrictions/constraints relating to pointing angles of our antennas.
- The process and conditions for renewals of <u>existing frequencies</u> assigned and application for <u>other frequencies</u> within this band be unaffected by these changes. Also we request confirmation that this will continue to be the case for the foreseeable future.

Speedcast objects to the future use of higher powers in outdoor setting. (This is in line with global industry practice)
