1	Oldham Theatre	<p>Oldham Theatre is a specialised cinema and screening venue located within the National Archives of Singapore at Canning Rise. Operated by the Asian Film Archive, the 134-seat theatre opened in 2019 to host curated screenings, retrospectives, festivals, and film-related talks.</p> <p>The venue is equipped with 4K digital projection and 35mm film capabilities to support both contemporary works and restored archival prints. Regular programmes include themed screenings and educational initiatives that highlight Asia's cinematic heritage. 2	The Arthouse Group	<p>Arts House Group is a Singapore-based not-for-profit arts organisation, established in 2002 as The Old Parliament House Limited, to enrich lives through the arts and cultural experiences. Its mission is to inspire and connect audiences with creative expression by managing heritage and multidisciplinary venues, presenting national festivals, and supporting diverse artistic practices.</p> <p>The organisation operates The Arts House at The Old Parliament, which includes a 75-seat Screening Room used for film screenings, private viewings, and media events. 3	Alliance Française de Singapour	<p>Alliance Française de Singapour is a cultural and language centre founded in 1949 to promote the French language and Francophone cultures in Singapore. Its 236-seat theatre hosts French and international film screenings, festivals, and community film events.</p> <p>The organisation also runs cultural programmes including exhibitions, talks, and performances that complement its cinematic offerings. Regular events such as the Francophonie Film Festival showcase curated films for diverse audiences. 4	SCAPE*	<p>*SCAPE Co. Ltd is a Singapore-based non-profit youth organisation established in 2007 to empower young people through creative expression and community engagement. Its Orchard Road facility includes flexible event spaces that can host film screenings, workshops, performances, and media events.</p> <p>*SCAPE supports youth-focused media initiatives, including the Film Facilitation Programme and Singapore Youth Film Festival. The venue provides emerging filmmakers with opportunities for skill development and audience engagement. 5	National Gallery Singapore	<p>The National Gallery Singapore is Singapore’s flagship visual arts institution, opened in 2015 to preserve and present modern and contemporary art from Singapore and Southeast Asia.</p> <p>It presents film-based programmes that explore the moving image as an artistic medium. Its venues, including the Ngee Ann Kongsi Auditorium and UOB Theatrette, host screenings for festivals, artist films, documentaries, and restored classics. A key initiative is Painting with Light, a biennial festival dedicated to films on art, arthouse cinema and restored classics.
